<p>(a) Every candidate seeking admission to the examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Education shall satisfy the following conditions :</p> <p>(i) He must have passed at least the B.A., B.Sc., or B.Com. Examination of the University of Delhi or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto.</p> <p>(ii) He must after passing the examination have pursued a regular course of study as hereinafter prescribed for not less than one academic year in the University or a recognised Institution.</p> <p>Every candidate shall be considered to have pursued a regular course of study unless he had attended at least three-fourths of the full number of lectures delivered during one academic year at a recognised institution and done at least fifty lessons of practical training in teaching in an approved school, out of which one half should be supervised lessons.</p> <p>The course of study and examination shall be as follows :</p>	<p>Every candidate seeking admission to the examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Education shall satisfy the conditions formulated and notified by NCTE in its Gazette Notification 2014 (REGD. 3. There shall be written examination for the Papers I, II, III, IV and V under Theory.

There shall be written examination for the Papers F.1, F.2, F.3, F.4, F.5, F.6, F.7, Pedagogy I, Pedagogy II and Elective Course under Theory.

4. The duration of each paper under Part 'A' shall be three hours and of each examination lesson under Part 'B', forty minutes.

5. (i) The preliminary assessment of Marks in Practical Skill in Teaching under part B shall be done by Internal teachers in the teaching institution concerned, on the basis of the candidate's practice teaching during the period of training. But for standardising the assessment done by the Internal teachers, a Co-ordinating Board shall be appointed by the University for final assessment. The Board shall comprise 3 external and 2 internal examiners with the Dean, Faculty of Education as the Chairman.

School Experience Programme under Internship :

- 100 marks: to be given by the subject specialist on the basis of planning, use of resources, preparation of teaching aids, etc. These marks will be given in three instalments: 25 after 4 weeks, 25 after 8 weeks, the remaining 50 at the end of the internship programme.
- 100 marks: to be given by the regular supervisor on the basis of classroom teaching in the same kind of instalments as are mentioned above;
- 50 marks: to be given by 2 rotational supervisors.
- 50 marks: to be given by the regular supervisor on the basis of the reflective journal maintained by the student.

(ii) The Board shall meet twice in a year, in November and February; and visit the teaching institutions to ensure a uniform standard between the different lecturers in the teaching institutions. The Board may require the production of the candidates notebooks of records of teaching done and lessons observed.

There shall be a Coordination Board to Coordinate the Field Observation and School Experience Programme (SEP) in the above institutions.

Note :- The B.Ed. Course is offered by the Department of Education, Delhi University and Lady Irwin College, New Delhi. The course in the latter institution is open to Home Science graduates only. Students are allowed the option to use Hindi as medium of examination.

Note :- The B.Ed. shall be offered by the Department of Education (CIE), University of Delhi, M.V. College of Education, Shyama Prasad Mukherjee College and Lady Irwin College, New Delhi. The course in the latter institution is open to Home Science graduates only. Students are allowed the option to use Hindi as medium of examination.

Any candidate who has obtained not less than fifty per cent of the aggregate marks but has failed in one subject only under Part 'A' or in Part 'B' of the examination, obtaining not less than twenty five per cent in that subject under Part 'A' or Part 'B' as the case may be, admitted to a Compartmental Examination in that subject only to be held on any date within 6 - 8 weeks of the announcement of the University Annual Examination result in that year, or if he fails to pass or fails to present himself at the Compartmental Examination, then at the next annual examination on payment on each occasion of the same fees as are prescribed for the B.Ed. examination and he shall be declared to have passed the examination in the year in which he successfully completes his examination.

7. A candidates who does not pass the B.Ed. Examination but has secured at least 50% marks in Part 'B'- Practice may, subject to the Ordinances, the admitted to a subsequent examination, on his being enrolled as an ex-student.

The minimum marks require to pass the examination shall be 40% in each written paper 45% in the written paper and the work done during the session relating to that Part A, 50% in Part B (Practice) and 50% in the aggregate.

The classification of result shall be as follows :

1. Distinction : 75% in the aggregate
2. 1st Division : 60% of total marks and above but below 75%
3. 2nd Division : 50% of total marks and above but below 60%

Any candidate who has obtained not less than fifty per cent of the aggregate marks but has failed in one subject only under Part 'A' of the examination, may be admitted to a Supplementary Examination in that subject to be held on any date within 6 - 8 weeks of the announcement of the University Annual Examination result in that year.

Any student who gets a Essential Repeat in First Year in any one theory paper, shall be permitted to attend classes in Second Year, but will have to pass the said Supplementary Examination before being permitted to appear in the Annual Examination at the end of the Second Year.

A candidate who does not pass the B.Ed. Examination (Second Year) but has secured at least 50% marks in School Experience Programme may, subject to the Ordinances, be admitted to a subsequent examination, on his being enrolled as an ex-student for the Second Year.

The minimum marks required to pass the examination shall be 40% in each written paper, 40% in the work done during the session relating to each theory paper, and together (combined) 45% in the theory paper and the work done during the session relating to the theory paper.

50% in Field Observation and School Experience Programme (SEP) and 50% in the aggregate.
